

This is Greece - the meeting point of three continents.

Where thousands of years ago the civilizations of the East met a new type of mind from the West- and left an idea of man that the world has never forgotten. The surrounding sea bore the exchange of ideas. Both ideas and goods were imported and exported in a constant flow that, in time, reached all the known ports of the Mediterranean - from its western to its eastern limits, through the Aegean to the shores of the Black Sea. Or as myths would have it: from the Pillars of Hercules to the land of the Golden Fleece. So you see that even in myths, the borders of Greece's influence were clearly laid out. The gods and heros may

have ceased to be. And history may change. But Greece and the sea are the same as they have always been, and Greece's strategic position has remained as it was-the meeting point of three continents.

Visitors to Greece are always amazed at the scope and compactness of this country. So much history; such variety of landscape; such influence on culture; such ideas; and all this from just a "small" area- a dot on the map. It seems out of all proportion to its size.

But Greece's greatness has been based on a few funtamental points: its strategic position in time and place, its ideas, and its clarity in expressing essentials. Contemporary Greece has been growing along with a developing world, utilizing resources, generating power, and expanding production possibilities.

But Greece has not forgotten its heritage. It is still aware of its strategic position, still concerned with importing and exporting ideas and goods, still desirous of pinpointing essentials-still important beyond the limitations of its size.

This too, is what the Thessaloniki International Trade Fair is all about. This is the concept behind "The Compact Fair".







The sea has always linked Greece closely with its Eastern Mediterranean neighbors. But now a highway and railroad network joins this country with all the commercial centers of Western and Eastern Europe. And airlines, of course, have expanded its world-wide contacts. A few hours flight time from anywhere on the globe, and you can arrive in Athens - just 35 air - minutes from Thessaloniki.

Thessaloniki is the industrial capital of northern Greece and the hub for all land, sea and air communicationsthe center of a growing industrial prosperity. Olympic Airways flights arrive directly from Frankfurt, Stuttgart, Dusseldorf, London, Brussels, and Zurich: Lufthansa has direct connections from Frankfurt and

Munich: Austrian Airlines fly in directly from Vienna; and British Airways from London.

The cargo ships anchored in the harbor are from most every imaginable maritime nation. The names one sees to learn new market potentials, on the trains and trucks also tell the story of countries and cities at the far reaches of an ever-expanding trade world.

This is Thessaloniki- home of the Thessaloniki International Trade Fair-The Compact Fair. Here for two weeks every September the trade world exhibits its latest wares - a selection of everything from the newest technological advances to the finest national handicrafts.

The fairgrounds have 91,276 m² of exhibition area. In 1976, 2,888 large-and small-scale industries exhibited here.

43 countries, including Greece itself, took part in the fair. More than 900,000 visitors and 35,000 commercial buyers from 47 countries attended*.

This Compact Fair shows the scope of modern-day trade. Here at the trade fair, exhibitors and commercial representatives come together to see the latest items and services. to study the situation first hand, to compare the latest product capabilities.

to talk to those people responsible for purchasing equipment, to meet those technicians who will finally use that equipment.



Foreign Official Participations

State-organized exhibitions are housed in individual pavilions representative of the exhibiting country's entire spectrum of production. In these exhibitions, products imported and already available in the Greek Market are included: usually Greek importer or the Greek branch of the producing company takes care of exhibiting the products.

Greek Artisans and Manufacturing Industry

Greek large-and small-scale manufacturers, who are interested in exporting their goods, exhibit in this area representing the Greek Industry, and show the high level of product quality.

Production Machinery

Major manufacturers of capital goods machinery and technological equipment participate in the Trade Fair where they are exhibited to a growing Greek industry and also to interested buyers from the Mediterranean countries,the Balkans, the Middle East, and North Africa.

Machines for wood, plastic, and iron; knitting, sewing and textile machinery; hotel and store equipment; baking ovens, pastry machines, etc.

Machinery and transportation

Modernized Greek Agriculture and the rapidly advancing construction industry are attracting more and more foreign firms specializing in farming and construction material. Every year at the Trade Fair, transactions dealing with large quantities of such products take place.

Autos

Greece does not produce automobiles as yet, and the Greek market is still far from saturated. This is the reason the latest models are such an attraction at the Trade Fair each year, it is here that they are introduced to the Greek market.

For People and their Home

To be found here are all the articles which make life at home more comfortable, more beautiful; articles that are necessary for every day life: household articles, electrical equipment, High Fidelity items, textiles for the home, furniture, fashion, foods and beverages.

Services

At the Fair, large public utility enterprises not only participate but also operate to serve the visitors. These include: The Telephone, Telegraph, Post Office and Banks. Likewise the Trade Fair itself offers special services of its own.

Many years of experience in organizing and carryng out a Trade Fair (as well as special exhibitions), is the best guarantee that the exhibitors will get efficient






















THESSALONIKI INTERNATIONAL TRADE FAIR

Where else could you find such compact possibilities offered with such warm hospitality?


















Write today your participation regulations.
